

## **Marian Your, Tri-umph Kennel USA**

A Pembroke Welsh Corgi first entered my heart shortly after my marriage in 1979, and I have this small tri dog to thank for a lifetime of adventures and friendships in dogs. My first venture was into the world of obedience training. Shortly thereafter I acquired a second corgi that I showed in both obedience and conformation.



I attended my first National Specialty in Kentucky in 1982. A highlight for me as a breeder/exhibitor came seven years later when I showed "Shirley," Ch. Tri-umph's Turning Heads, CD NA, sired by the English import Ch. Cinonnie Cavalier, to Best of Breed at the National Specialty in 1989. All of my current dogs are descended from Shirley. I repeated the feat of winning Best of Breed at our National Specialty at the end of the lead of GCHG Tri-umph Topsy-Tart of Raven-C, "Joy," under Judge John Burgess in 2025.

Since retiring in 2010 from business and teaching, I have kept myself busy with PWCCA Publications and Board responsibilities, judging conformation, serving as an officer and board member of the GHPWCF, serving as secretary for the Baytown Kennel Club, and breeding and showing Pembrokes. Agility is my most recent passion, and it has made me more appreciative of the correlation between form and function in this athletic breed.

I have been licensed as a judge for Pembroke Welsh Corgis since 2003, and I also judge Australian Shepherds, Cardigan Welsh Corgis and German Shepherd Dogs. I have had the honor of judging at the PWCC of Southern California, Western Reserve, Greater Houston, Mayflower, Gaitway (2010) Ohio Valley, PWCC of Greater Atlanta, PWCC of The Rockies, Gaitway (2017) and most recently, Greater Houston PWCF, Garden State PWCC, and Greater Atlanta Specialties. I am honored to have been asked to judge Pembroke Welsh Corgis at Eurocorgi in 2026.
